Athletic Requirements

- A current physical signed by a doctor (you need this every year to participate in sports. It is easiest to get this in June so it
 is ready for the entire school year.
- Complete the online k12 form titled "Junior High Athletics Packet". Families only need to fill this form out one time for the entire school year.
- STUDENT needs to sign up on the google form for each sport to make sure that you are eligible to participate
- There are no cuts for our teams, we teach you what you need to know to participate in the sport, and we play the surrounding middle schools in the Yolo County Athletic League (YCAL) consisting of schools from Davis, Woodland, Dixon, Esparto, & Winters.
- Even though there are no cuts, there are rules surrounding attendance and behavior with regard to participating on an Emerson team.
 - Athletes must maintain a 2.0-grade point average and no F's
 - Athletes must attend all practices and games
 - Athletes are good teammates, show positive sportsmanship at all times, and are coachable.
 - While coaches do their best, equal playing time is not guaranteed in games.
 - Playing time is earned through attending practices, having a positive attitude, being coachable, showing an understanding of what has been taught and doing your best to execute those skills and/or plays, following directions during practice.

- All initial questions/concerns for teachers should be initiated by the student either in person, via Canvas inbox or by email.
- After a first attempt by the student to communicate with the teacher has occurred, it is then appropriate for the parent/guardian to communicate with the teacher.
- If a parent has a concern, before contacting administration and/or counseling, our hope is that the parent will reach out to the teacher as their first step.

Attendance

- While illness is the #1 reason for an excused absence, please be aware that

- If you receive a robocall from the office, please carefully listen to the entire call, this will be helpful for specific class periods your student might have missed. If it is a mistake, the parent needs to contact the attendance secretary.
- Please call the office or send a note with your student when they are absent or late so that we can excuse them.
- If your student is not feeling well and texts you from class, please advise them to come immediately to the office to see the nurse where we can support them and are aware if a parent/guardian comes to pick them up. ALL Students must sign-out in the office when they leave campus for any reason.

Attendance

School Attendance Is Vital To Success!

- Later start times designed specifically for students!
 - Students need adequate sleep!
 - Students should contact teachers/school with parent support if homework or other things are getting in the way of learning – we can help!
- We need students to be on-time (especially their first class of the day!)
 - If you have transportation issues, please check in with the office for support

Safety & Discipline

• If the school site administrator determines a violation of education code has occurred, a suspension may be delivered. If the parent/guardian does not agree with the suspension, they may file an appeal. Specific information about the appeal process can be found on the suspension form.

Emerson administration and counseling have been trained and practice a restorative

style of discipline as a part of our discipline strategy.

- If students are continually late to class, teachers may assign detention. Please see tardy policy in the Emerson planner.
 - Students are allowed two free tardies per quarter per class.
 - Once a student reaches their third tardy they will have earned one detention for the third and one detention for every tardy thereafter until the end of the quarter.
- Students are not do be using cell phones during classes. It is a teacher's discretion to allow phones during work time. If cell phones become disruptive or a distraction, the teacher will contact the office. Cell phone violation contracts will be assigned if this is a continual problem during class.




On the yellow slides below, department chairs have created a short video or a slide deck for students and families to let them know what to expect from their courses for rising 7th grade students

Pro Tips & Tricks

• Students will learn what supplies are needed AFTER meeting their teacher on the first day of school. Just bring your ChromeBook, paper, and pen/pencil on the first day of school. Keep your Google Drive organized

Bring your student ID to school daily

Pro Tips & Tricks
